


## Kromme catchment "Towards a Living Landscape"

## What did we do so far:

- 1. Workshop in November at the Learning Village
  - ✓ Lot of knowledge, time for action
  - ✓ Improve communication in the catchment
- 2. Interview with the farmers/ land users
- 3. Workshop in March with farmers/ land users





## Interview with the farmers/land users (pre-results)

- ✓ There are a lot of relatively new farmers in the Kromme river catchment;
- ✓ Farming is getting more difficult in the last ten years;
- ✓ In general landowners think wetlands are an important part of the Kromme river system;
- ✓ However most of the landowners do not see any personal benefits from wetlands;
- ✓ Almost all farmers dislike alien vegetation and have problems with them;
- ✓ Most farmers love wildlife on their land.





- ✓ All farmers try to farm in a way that farming in fifty years is still possible;
- ✓ A lot of farmers are interested in a voluntary conservation agreement IF they receive incentives;
- ✓ Almost all farmers are interested in workshops about farming and conservation issues, (no talkshops);
- ✓ Almost all farmers are interested in opportunities for tourism.
- ✓ There are only a few people everybody knows;
- ✓ Generally landowners only know near neighbours, or the people on the side of Kareedouw they are on;
- ✓ In general they are very willing to work with different organizations, also nature conservation organizations.





## Workshop in March with farmers/ land users

- ✓ Concerns about water rights AND improve their farming practises
- ✓ Improve water quantity and quality for the municipality downstream, with no financial recompense.
- ✓ The need to start a "Kromme River Communication Forum" or committee.
- ✓ The need to improve communication within the farming community
- ✓ Concerns were expressed in terms of alerting government to the potential of the area, and planting ideas for the government to reclaim farms in the area.
